Choke in horses

Hopefully you have been able to meet HPL's newest resident. Her name is Belle and she is as sweet as any southern belle you'll ever meet. Belle had an incident of choking that left her esophagus scarred. Several rescues turned her down due to her special feeding needs. Belle needs to be fed separately from other horses so her food can be specially prepared.

Choke occurs when partially chewed food gets caught in the esophagus. The horse is still able to breathe but cannot swallow. Causes of choke include inability to chew food properly, eating too fast, low production of saliva or partial obstruction in the esophagus from a tumor or old scar tissue. Dental problems can cause inadequate chewing and contribute to choke. Aspiration pneumonia can be a secondary condition caused by choke. It happens when food, water or saliva accumulates in the back of the throat, entering the trachea and settling in the lungs.

Signs of choke include: difficulty swallowing, no interest in food, coughing, repeated head and neck extension in a downward direction, discharge from the nostrils, increased salivation or drooling, increased heart rate and possibly a noticeable lump under the neck. If choke is suspected, a veterinarian should be contacted immediately.

Scheduling regular dental exams, especially for senior horses can greatly reduce the chances of choke. For those senior horses, senior feed is easier to chew and digest. Moist hay and grain is also easier to chew and will hopefully prevent choke. For those horses that eat too fast, placing a few large rocks in the feed pan and allowing more turnout time to graze between meals can help them eat more slowly.

Belle now requires her hay and grain to be watered down. She is getting flakes of alfalfa that are broken apart and soaked with water. She is being fed a senior grain for now since it is easier to chew. If you visit Belle at the ranch, you may notice a sign on her stall saying she cannot have any treats. Unfortunately with the scarring in her esophagus, Belle cannot eat hard treats. However, she is getting lots of love, care and attention from everyone at HPL. HPL is happy to accommodate her needs and delighted to have her at the ranch. --Dawn Renee Neff Certified Veterinary Technician
