HPL Takes Two Plus Two

In July, HPL took in two mares with two foals from a Wyoming impound case.

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: The HSUS and Local Welfare Groups Come to the Aid of Nearly 100 Horses Seized by Wyoming Livestock Board

The Humane Society of the United States, Front Range Equine Rescue and Denkai Animal Sanctuary assisted the Wyoming Livestock Board with the care and placement of nearly 100 horses seized from a Lincoln County property. The Wyoming Livestock Board and the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department removed the animals from the property following an ongoing criminal investigation into allegations of neglect. When officials arrived on the Fairview property in late May they reportedly found nearly 100 horses, including some dead horses and others whose medical conditions were so severe they were humanely euthanized. The Wyoming Livestock Board then transported the remaining horses to the Cheyenne Stockyards, where they have been receiving rehabilitative care under the supervision of the state veterinarian. According to veterinarians on the scene, most were in poor health and showing signs of neglect. Many of the animals were extremely emaciated and suffering from a variety of medical ailments including overgrown, infected hooves, open wounds and parasite infestation.

The Wyoming Livestock Board and the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department initiated this case. When the owner failed to post bond, the animals became custody of the state. The horses are being held at the Cheyenne Stockyards for temporary shelter. All of the horses are being checked by a team of veterinarians and given any necessary immediate medical care. The rescued horses are in the custody of the Wyoming Livestock Board and will be cared for by The HSUS in conjunction with local rescue groups until suitable adoptive homes can be found.

Chip started gaining weight and was doing better, but then in the summer of 2010, he started failing. He was losing weight and was having a hard time walking. After I decided to bring him in the barn to give him extra attention for his health needs, he started to improve. Chip would spend his nights in the barn and days outside around the other horses. It took many volunteers extra hours to care for Chip, but the volunteers were happy to do it. Chip had a very special volunteer named Pam who made sure the barn was clean and spent extra time grooming and walking him. Chip filled our days at the rescue with his love that he gave back to all of us that cared for him. We lost chip on March 30, 2011 to colic.

When HPL brings in any horse, we make a commitment to do the best within our limits for that animal. I see volunteers making lasting connections to all our horses and that is what we are all about. Many of our horses don't get a home away from HPL, but they still have a great family of loving people to care for them.

Chip's special volunteer came across this poem when we lost Chip and I wanted to share it. It really says how we all feel about the horses in our care.
