Help A Horse Day is a national celebration and contest by the ASPCA (The American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals) to raise awareness of the plight of abused, neglected and abandoned horses. Equine rescues and sanctuaries are encouraged to host one or more events highlighting the work they do and showing community members how they can become involved. Non-profit horse organizations across the nation are holding individual fundraisers during the weekend starting Friday, April 22.

Equine groups will be in the running for eleven cash awards for the events they hold. The grand prize is an award of \$25,000.

The Horse Protection League is holding three events during the Help A Horse Day weekend and contest. They are:

New Arrivals!

The Horse Protection League has three baby Navajo horses: two colts and one filly! These youngsters were originally picked up by The Colorado Horse Rescue Network (CHRN) from a Navajo reservation near the Four Corners area of Colorado where they were among 20 horses facing starvation. CHRN reached out to HPL and other horse rescues to find more specific help for these horses. They will remain in quarantine for the next 30 days, but they are already adapting to the abundance of food and kindness from the HPL family!

Oscar is a 7-year-old pinto gelding pony. HPL rescued him from Montana upon request from a humane group there that needed assistance. He has recently been started under saddle and has had over 90 days of professional training. A great horse to grow with!

Adoption Fee – \$400

Ranger, a Thoroughbred colt, came to HPL in August 2014 as a yearling. He was found roaming the streets in poor health and was never claimed. He has recovered since arriving at HPL. Ranger has done groundwork, but has not yet been trained under saddle. He is playful and fun. **Adoption Fee – \$400**



Mattie, a 10-year-old registered Quarter Horse mare, came to us unwanted and sick. She is now healthy and rideable. Mattie stands 15 hands. Our trainer Tucker Black (pictured) gives Mattie a workout once a month. Great horse for an experienced rider!

These horses can no longer be ridden, but want a forever home. They have great manners and would make great companions to other horses or humans who just want to have an animal to love!



Maya, a black Arabian, is thought to be around 31 years old. Maya was brought to us through Arvada Animal Control as an owner surrender. She had been confined in a small pen and neglected. She has recovered, and is sweet and delightful.

Jackie came to us through Jefferson County Animal Control very underweight and in overall poor health. She has trust issues and needs a calm but confident handler who provides reassurance and love. Companion only. She stands to be haltered, brushed, and has very nice ground manners. Born 1993, Arabian mare. Jackie is Gracie's mother.

Romeo came to HPL in 2003 from an owner who could no longer care for him. He is a handsome and proud Arabian. Romeo was shown in Level 2 Dressage. Even though he is no longer rideable, he loves groundwork and has good ground manners. An ideal home for Romeo would be one with other companions and a lot of love. 22 years old, gelding, 14:1 hh.

Sara Jane is a 7-year-old mare that came to us from another Colorado rescue. She is friendly and loveable. She can be a companion horse only. Come say hello and help her find a forever, loving home.

Bobby was surrendered by his owner. He was a previous competition jumper. Bobby is very gentle, loving and enjoys being at HPL. He is easy to work around and has good ground manners. Due to back injuries from jumping, Bobby is not rideable but loves to get out and run or do groundwork.

Raja came to us from an owner who could no longer keep him. Raja has good ground manners, is playful, and requires consistent farrier work. He is beautiful and easy to love. Born 1994, registered black Arabian gelding. Companion only.

Chance arrived at HPL in May of 2009, along with Striker, both 9-10 month old mustangs and both in critical condition. They were part of a large rescue of mustangs from the 3 Strikes Ranch near Alliance, NE, where 74 of nearly 250 mustangs had been found dead from starvation. Chance was adopted as a yearling, but circumstances forced his return to HPL.

Gracie, a 10-year old Arabian mare, came to us through Jefferson County Animal Control very underweight and in overall poor health. She stands to be haltered, brushed, and has very nice ground manners. Companion only. Born 2004, Gracie is Jackie's daughter.

Daisy, on the left, is 3 years old and was the first burro (donkey) to arrive at HPL. She was rescued at Canyon City through the Bureau of Land Management adoption program. She loves to be groomed.

Millie, on the right, is 4 years old and came from Long Hopes Donkey Rescue in Colorado. She loves to bray ("talk") and is easy to handle. Both are jennets (female donkeys) and are used in many of HPL's educational programs.







Princess, a 14-year-old miniature horse mare, is the smallest equine at HPL. She is only 9:2 hands in height, but she is very big in personality! She represents HPL at events and parades and sometimes wears a tiara, to the delight of the onlookers. She loves the attention and is used in educational programs at the ranch, for both children and adults.



Billy originally came to HPL in 1996, but was returned to HPL in 2006 due to owner surrender. Special farrier care is needed. Billy is helpful with the Vet Tech Internship Program, school tours and education programs. Big boy with a big heart!

Giving Back

My name is Shelley Ferraro and I'm a certified equine massage therapist and body worker. Carol Miyagishima and I have the privilege of doing bodywork on the wonderful horses and donkeys that have been rescued and brought to HPL. These horses and donkeys have been through so much in their sweet lives, and Carol and I want to help them to feel better emotionally and physically and to bring comfort and wellbeing to their lives. We want to help them as best we can to live their lives with less restriction and pain in their bodies and to have more freedom of movement as well.

When adopted, some of these magnificent creatures will have jobs being a pasture friend to another animal. Others who are physically capable will have more active jobs such as riding. We want to do bodywork on both the pasture buddy and the workhorse so that they can move easily and comfortably with little or no restriction or pain. This takes time and can't be accomplished in one session. Bodywork is like peeling away the layers of an onion. It takes time for these restrictions to build up in the animal's body and it takes time to help release them.

Carol and I are happy when we as body workers, contribute to the mission of HPL and make a difference in the lives of the horses and donkeys. So for those horses adopted in 2016, we'd like to send them to their forever home with a free two-hour massage! Our wish is that they will be loved and treated with dignity, that they are well cared for, and in a loving home. When you have finalized your adoption, HPL will help to arrange the bodywork session.


As I mentioned, spring is also a time for renewal. So if your membership has lapsed, spring is a great time to renew.

Want to Help?

The Horse Protection League welcomes and appreciates all different types of contributions! The ranch is primarily operated by volunteers who share their time and energy through the vast array of volunteer programs. Some programs require some horse handling experience, while many others do not. If you are interested in volunteering, please call HPL at 303-216-0141. Annie Oden, our Volunteer Coordinator, will contact you.

Does your family, young and old alike, drink beverages that come in aluminum cans? You can save and donate your aluminum cans by dropping them off at the HPL ranch. The income from the cans is saved to a special account for purchasing a new pickup truck for the ranch. Right now, there is approximately \$6,000 in the fund! "Drink and save" is our motto!

Want to provide useful items that are part of maintaining the horses and the ranch? Here are just a few items that are needed: mucking rakes, wheelbarrows, heavy duty water hoses (25', 50'), rubber feeding pans (3 & 6.5 gal) — just to name a few.
