Dash – This handsome pony is approximately 13 years old (possibly foaled around 2004), stands 10.3 hands, and has a unique chocolate coloring with a flaxen mane and tail. He was brought to us September of 2016 by Colorado Horse Rescue Network. He is halter broke and continues to get friendlier while here! Dash is very sociable with other animals and would make a great companion as-is. He is also intelligent and sound and could be trained to do more with his forever home!

Hobbs – Brought to us on return through no fault of his own May of 2017, Hobbs is a very dashing black and white pinto pony who stands 11 hands high. She loads, ties, and grooms with no issues. She is available as companion only and is safe for beginners to handle.

Although he is broke to ride, an old neck injury leaves him suitable for companion only. Romeo is friendly, intelligent, and personable but he will need a home that does not permit pushy behavior.

Our HPL Mascots





HPL was pleased to offer the Devereux Program for three weeks each in June and July this year. Devereux is a residential treatment center for at-risk teens, and their staff has been bringing their clients out to HPL for many years. Devereux staff and four teens came out on Tuesday evenings when it had cooled off a bit so everyone could enjoy the experience at the ranch. Annie Oden and Carolyn Gable volunteered as HPL "buddies" for the June group; Barb Malone volunteered for the July group; and Carol Molnia, Carol "C.C." Holmes and Joni Dyer volunteered for both the June and July groups. The HPL "buddies" were paired with a Devereux teen and a horse. This year Jackie, Boo, Two-Step, Princess, Britney and Romeo were offered to the teens; all were chosen for one or both groups. Activities included teaching how to approach, halter, lead, measure height and weight, and groom their horses. Teens also had the choice to take their horses over the obstacle course. The final session for each group was spent decorating their horses with braids, ribbons and feathers. We even had a parade of decorated horses!
