

With over 15 years experience in the animal and veterinary industry, Dr. Leticia German has worked in the Colorado Front Range area for the last 5 years. She treats a wide variety of large and small animal species with a particular focus on holistic care in the true sense of treating the whole animal, blending both western and alternative medicine. She received her Doctorate of Veterinary Medicine from Colorado State University and also holds a Master of Science degree in Animal Nutrition and is certified in medical acupuncture.

I was born with a love for horses and have been riding for longer than I can remember. As a teenager I spent many summers at my aunt's ranch in South Dakota, but my true passion for training was born when I purchased my own horse, Lena. In the first few days I worked with Lena, my view of the relationship between horse and human was transformed. I began to understand that relationship between horse and human needs to be based on trust, respect, and consistency. My passion has grown over this past year when I adopted and started my first BLM Mustang, Lakota. Lakota and I traveled to Fort Worth, Texas in September of 2011 to compete in the Supreme Extreme Mustang Makeover.

I have studied numerous different trainers and styles to develop a technique that works for me, as well as for the horse I am working with. My focus is to build a relationship where both the horse and the human get the most out of the training. I want to make horses safer and more pleasurable for people to be around. When I have a horse in training, the goal is to create a solid foundation beginning with ground work. Once the rider and the horse have mastered the ground work, we move to working under saddle. As the training continues and this trusting partnership grows, the possibilities are endless.

Over the past year I have worked with several of the horses at HPL. I have evaluated several horses for their trainability and adoptability. For example, last year HPL rescued two mares, Spirit and Ivory, and their foals, Tucker and Carmel. I have spent many hours working with these 4 horses to form a trusting relationship. I have been coming to HPL to work with them one to two times a week. I am proud to say they have now started to trust people and are beginning to see us as partners. Tucker Black

Recycling & More Recycling

The Horse Protection League (HPL) of Arvada, Colorado is reaching out to the community in hopes we can become partners in recycling aluminum cans. Currently, HPL has an aluminum can recycling program but we would like to expand it with your support. We use the proceeds from this program to help with the daily cost of caring for our rescued horses. Not only do we help the environment through recycling, we have also found a creative way to earn money.

Our mission at HPL is to rescue neglected and abused equines. While some have come to us from owners who no longer want them or cannot care for them, others have been rescued from abuse, neglect or even saved from slaughter. We provide farrier, dental, veterinary and rehabilitative care, striving then to place these animals in loving homes.

The Horse Protection League works with local animal control officers in cases of neglect and abuse. We also conduct classes and clinics in proper horse care. HPL is supported 100 percent by donations and volunteers as our monies go directly back into the organization. Last year, our average average expenses were approximately \$7000 per month. That's a lot of aluminum cans!

We are asking you to help us in our mission and become partners in recycling aluminum cans. Our address is 17999 West 60th Avenue, Golden and we have a clearly marked area for the cans to be delivered. Special pick-up arrangements can be made. We welcome any amount, small or large. If you are willing to accept this partnership, we will formally thank you in our quarterly newsletter that reaches all of our members.




