Anna Twinney

For three days at the end of September, Anna Twinney took me on a journey into myself and into the language of the horse. Anna is a world renowned animal communicator, natural horsemanship clinician, certified Reiki Master and founder of the Reach Out to Horses program based in Golden. She has partnered with HPL for clinics and her methods are being adopted into our own enrichment program for our horses.

The 3-day clinic that she presented at HPL allowed participants to work with their own horses or partner with an HPL horse. I was paired with Jackie, an Arabian mare that came to HPL about a year ago neglected and underweight. The clinic was a combination of exercises to help us understand the language of the horse and hands-on exercises to see the principles in action. For example, in one exercise, a participant left the group while we decided on a simple task for a "trainer" participant to teach. The catch was, when the first participant returned, the trainer participant could say, first, only

"yes," then only "no," and finally either "yes or "no" until the task was accomplished. While the results were sometimes hilarious, we learned to appreciate the critical importance of timing as well as the difficulty the horse may have in understanding our directions. Over the three days, we did round pen work, trust and intimacy exercises, and spook busting. We learned about eye contact, body language, managing our energy, intent and connection. Jackie was a perfect partner, willing and highly intuitive, yet demanding that I lead her with confidence and provide assurance that she would be safe. Each day was both exhausting and exhilarating, for both of us, and for me, a glimpse into a magical world that I can't wait to visit again.
